- 1) – Water pressure rockets have sometimes been the only activity in a workshop, and sometimes been together with cars. Also “Cars” have been together with the marble-slide. This seems not to affect the numbers significantly, and therefore all water rockets are combined, and all cars, meaning that some of the activities are included twice in the calculations.
- 2) – The Biophilia workshops were tests. One worked out very well, another fairly well, but the first was clearly a test.
- 3) – LED torches are not the great hit in 4th and 5th grade (where in total 7 have answered, of these 2 answered “very good” and 5 answered “good”). In the older classes this workshop is very popular (around 90% “very good”).
- 4) – The sweet life did not work in the first workshop due to technical issues, but worked well in the following workshops. In the following workshops 68% said “very good”, and 16% said respectively “good” and “no opinion”. In particular with the 7th grade it worked well, as 100% said “very good”.

Looking at **gender**:

Girls were PROBABLY more interested in the workshop “Light and colours”

Boys were PROBABLY more interested in “Cars”, and

Boys were MAY BE more interested in “The sweet life”.
